The following instructions were issued in the SLEC Meeting

- 1. Supervision mechanism should be strengthened at District and State level for effective implementation and monitoring of the schemes.
- 2. Strengthen the existing Government nurseries in order to make available good quality planting material to the farmers.
- 3. The Department of Horticulture should develop Ornamental plant nurseries in Hyderabad so as to produce and supply seasonal flowering plants etc., to cater to the needs of households / Public to avoid dependency on private nurseries.
- 4. Model nurseries should be developed in the existing Government nurseries in the districts for demonstration and production of good quality plant material, in addition to creating employment opportunities for the rural women and youth.
- 5. Cultivation of exotic and rare vegetables should also be encouraged to ensure year round supply.
- 6. Crop specific clusters or hot spots should be identified in and around Hyderabad to develop satellite vegetable production centers which are linked to the vegetable markets and Malls duly coordinating with the Marketing Department.
- 7. Ensure better linkages for the existing vegetable clusters to the Rytubazaars with immediate effect.
- 8. Identify group expert Scientists (TSG) on Vegetable cultivation to guide the farmers in adoption of best practices and preparation of crop calendars.

9. In this effect, a Steering Committee meeting is convened on 25.06.2014 with the officials of Horticulture, Marketing Department and Vegetable farmers to evolve the modalities to chalk out a programme for the next three months for effective utilization of incentives/resources available with the Departments to attain self sufficiency in vegetable production.
